Dear Rosalyn,

Thank you for your response regarding the paperwork; hopefully you will speed it through. You profess to have read all of the paperwork so you will remember my early correspondence to your predecessor about the abuse of Child X by his Head Teacher.

The school had failed its Ofsted and there was a change of Head Teacher and ethos; a short sharp shock to bring back control and improve results. Therefore the powers that be brought in a military type.

Child X had severe processing difficulties as seen by the list of conditions making up his diagnosis. He was clearly not capable of clear thought processes, in fact he should not have been at school at all as they were not geared up for his special needs. He had limited understanding of his environment, low ability to speak and communicate, except at basic level. He should not have been put at risk.

The previous Head Teacher had tried to get specialised help but under the new regime Child X had to comply with the norm. He had no such capacity so did not conform and ended up at loggerheads with the new Head who raised her voice, dragged him down corridors and made him sit quietly without moving. He was severely traumatised as he had no understanding of his wrong-doing or why this was happening to him. In one of our sessions, whilst talking about how he perceived the events, he suggested that it was like listening to someone talking on the side of a swimming pool whilst you are underwater. Even when he recognised a word he did not understand it.

He went to Northampton soon after this and received good care and one on one care at a specialised school and progressed well. Once he returned to Hertfordshire he was put into a mainstream school with no back up or help, and was expected to cope with the norm. He was severely bullied and traumatised again with another major failure.

The next few years consisted of over-medication which led to paranoia and depression and the mother having to stabilise her child ready for the next school/placement which was going to sort him out. Time and time again after the honeymoon period he constantly tried to escape and was restrained, each time traumatising him and blocking him further. Social Services (SS) seem to be at the bottom of much of this due to their biased approach based on poor parent/poor parented child or naughty boy. During his Hertfordshire ordeal the child did not receive at any time the right back up and help he needed. Education failed repeatedly due to the wrong diagnosis and not fulfilling his specialist needs. They clearly had no understanding of the child, and did not engage with him at any stage.

Initially all I wanted from your predecessor was a letter of introduction to the correct authority which was capable of dealing with the enormity of the situation, particularly as I had been denied my right to refer and had to take the Council to tribunal.

Dear.....,

Mr Lamb is of good character and has concerns over the handling of a child. His paperwork to a successful tribunal is attached, which was not contested, etc


All this leaves multiple questions:

- 1). Why did the Regulator say he had a Duty of Care and would bring it up at the GCC, only to retire from the battlefield without doing anything? (clear in paperwork received.)
- 2). Why did the BCA say they would stand up for diagnosis and support me, and then did nothing?
- 3). Why was my reputation damaged by being removed from the Register for no reason? (I won my appeal tribunal.)
- 4). Why were Complaints Procedures not followed as per your website?
- 5). Why was my diagnosis not accepted, even when backed up by an educational psychologist, or the child not referred for further assessment, (Advancement of the profession.);and not accepted by the Council and its departments even though there had been communication from your predecessor and the BCA.
- 6). Why the first Clinical Psychologists notes went missing at a crucial time after the Regulator had referred to the Ombudsman.

The list goes on, hopefully the paperwork will answer some of these questions.

For the record, I would value your opinion.
