

Dear Mr. Sunak,

Just to clear any confusion over my allegations of child abuse and laws you have probably broken, I give you the accepted understanding of my charges:

1. Perverting the course of justice:

- This is an offence committed when a person prevents justice from being served on themselves or another party.

2. Aiding and abetting:

- A) That the party knew that the other person was going to commit or had committed a crime.

- B) That they intended their presence or actions to aid the other person or persons to commit the crime.

3. Abuse of power/authority:

- This takes the form of malfeasance in office (intentional conduct that is wrongful and unlawful by officials or public employees) or official abuse of power, which is the commission of an unlawful act, done in an official capacity, which affects the performance of official duties.

The three laws are all criminal and come with a jail term in normal circumstances, so I understand your reluctance to act. You did not create the system, but you have avoided direct action to solve the problem.

I have searched but cannot find any exclusions to the law that you could use. Laws are for everyone! You cannot pick and choose to your advantage.
